Description:	This course is for non-native learners of English. Students will develop the listening and speaking skills necessary for participating in college-level classroom discussion, incorporating oral presentation and fostering critical listening skills needed for taking notes and understanding lectures.

Practice pronunciation and enunciation features determined by the instructor. Practice appropriate listening skills in a variety of classroom situations including lectures, videos and student speeches. Create outlines for class presentations. Employ language appropriate to audience and situation while speaking.
